

RTI for Tier I Elementary Students

The goal of RTI for Tier I should allow for the reteaching of standards that students are struggling with rather than specific skill deficits. It is also an ideal time to provide enrichment activities for advanced students.

Standards based Assessment should guide planning.

IT SHOULD BE.....

- Researched Based
- High Quality **Standards** Based Instruction
- Planned for and documented in your planbooks
- Use Assessments from classtime to guide Instruction
- Go Beyond Regular Classroom Instruction
- Teacher Directed
- Provide Opportunities to *enrich* the Regular Instruction that is planned
- Engaging
- Enhance skills that were taught in regular instruction
- Data Driven

Work generated in RTI should be used to guide planning only. Taking grades during RTI time to be used for grades in your regular instructional block is not best practice.

Students who are receiving skill specific intervention in Tier II or III cannot be required to complete or make up assignments that were completed in the Tier I RTI group. If you feel that the material being presented is something that all students need, it should be completed in your regular instructional time instead of RTI. 😊

- unstructured
- Homework help
